Prep – Year 12

The uniform creates an identity for the school and is a practical way that students can show a sense of pride in themselves and their school.

Families have the responsibility to ensure students leave for school prepared to meet the personal presentation and uniform code articulated below.

Consequences for not meeting the standard articulated

Foundation Phase: Parents notified.

Junior Phase: Parents notified and consequences followed for repeated infringements.

Secondary: Demerit. Accumulation of five demerits is a lunch detention. Repeated infringements and parents will be notified.

Uniform – All Students

Please Note:

- Sports shorts should be of a modest length
- Dress or skirt is to sit **on or just above the knee**

Winter uniform note:

- Track pants listed are inexpensive plain navy (no stripes or branding) available from Big W or similar stores
- If girls wish to change from tights or stockings during the day, they will need to bring white socks
- Track pants/leggings are not to be worn with skirts or dresses
- Secondary girls may wear $\frac{3}{4}$ to full leggings under school shorts for gym and dance, during that time only and must wear correct sport uniform outside these lesson times
- We encourage students to bring shorts to change into as the day becomes warm
- On extremely cold days, rare in the Whitsundays, students may wear an additional coat over College jacket until the temperature warms up. The coat colour should reflect the College uniform colours

Shoes & Socks - Primary and Secondary

Shoes

Shoes form part of our uniform. Student access to class is dependent on uniform compliance. Please work from this information.

Two options exist:

Option A

Completely black (no stripes or non-black logos), all leather uppers, traditionally laced or velcro, able to be polished with black polish, trainers. Small portions of mesh or tiny logos are permitted.



But be careful, the shoes must look like those pictured - they must not:

- have thick laces or flat soles
- be Sports/Skate designs, like Globe Brand
- be designs with mesh or material or plastic strips etc
- have visible large non-black logos
- be canvas or suede



Option B

Traditional Clark or Bata like style entirely black enclosed leather school shoes for formal uniform (available at local shoe shops) and the approved completely black leather trainers for sports uniform days.

Note definite heel and sole on dress shoes



Shoe Maintenance

- All laced shoes need to be correctly tied with black laces
- Black shoe polish to be used on all shoes to maintain condition
- Worn shoes need to be replaced

Specific competition shoes (e.g. footy shoes) may be used in formal athletics or organised competitive games.

Socks

Primary Girls - White ankle turn-down

Secondary Girls - White ankle turn-down or white 1/4 crew socks (to sit at least 3 cm above the ankle)

All Boys - Navy ankle turn-down or black 1/4 crew socks (to sit at least 3 cm above the ankle)

Anklet socks are not permitted.

Hair Requirements

Students need to have conventional independent school hairstyles that enable the school hat to be worn correctly. All students need to ensure their hair cut/style meets the Uniform Code.

Boys

- Neat and practical haircut/style
- Short hair that is away from ears, collar and eyebrows (short back and sides) – hair can't be tucked behind or over ears
- No undercuts, steps, mullets, mohawks, or tracks and hair is to be graded/blended in
- Shaved hair is allowed
- Example of appropriate style cut:



- Boys need to be clean shaven always
- Natural hair look in terms of colour:
 - Primary School (Prep – Year 6) students need to maintain their natural hair colour
 - Middle Phase (Year 7 – Year 10) students need to maintain their natural hair colour
 - Senior Phase (Year 11 – Year 12) students may have additional natural colour variations and may have neat steps

Girls

- Neat and practical haircut/style
- Collar length hair (touches collar) needs to be completely tied back
- No hair on face – if short it needs to be behind your ears, if long, then as above
- Fringe must not be able to touch your eyebrows
- Natural hair look in terms of colour.
 - Primary School (Prep – Year 6) students need to maintain their natural hair colour
 - Middle Phase (Year 7 – Year 10) students need to maintain their natural hair colour
 - Senior Phase (Year 11 – Year 12) students may have additional natural colour variations (high and low lights)
- Girls' hair accessories (ribbons, small bows, clips) are to be navy or white (or actual school pattern) with any of the uniforms
- Girls' hair ties may be natural hair colour, navy or black
- Sports Carnivals - girls may wear hair accessories and hair ties that match their house shirt

Consequences for not meeting hair standard

We trust families will honour their commitment in following school policies and rules and that our intervention is not required.

If students do not follow these rules they will be given a grace period to have their hair meet the code:

- Student will first be warned by the home class teacher.
- If no action, the home class teacher phones the parents and agree on a set date. Grace period agreed on.
- If still not done after a set date, a letter will be sent home to parents. Parents will have a week to fix their child's hair.
- If still not correct hair, student is removed from break times until the hair is fixed.
- If the hair is still not rectified, then a meeting with the principal will be called.
- Wrong style or colour: immediate action is required by family before child may return.

Make-up

We promote skin care. All students are encouraged to apply sun protective moisturiser each day before coming to school. With our focus on healthy living and study we do not believe make-up nor the time it takes should be part of school life.

However, to help students through their school life, we want to work with our students by permitting the following:

- **Senior Phase Girls (Year 11 – Year 12):** If you feel it is necessary, you may use basic make-up to achieve a light and natural look. Please understand it is particularly the heavy use of mascara and eyeliner that will make you outside the code
- **Middle Phase Girls (Year 7 – Year 10):** No make-up permitted but you may use a 'natural looking' (make-up that matches your skin tone) light foundation if you need to.
- **Primary School Girls:** No make-up allowed
- Lip balm is permitted

The following are not permitted:

- Nail polish or nail decoration (including extensions)
- Coloured contact lenses
- Tinting of lashes and brows

Jewellery and Body Art

Girls

Allowable jewellery for girls is two pairs of plain earrings e.g. sleepers (no bigger than 1 cm in diameter) or small studs. No pearls. Earrings are to be worn in the lower ear lobes. New piercings are not exempt from the policy.

A traditional looking, functional watch or tech fitness watch, those that look like and act as a watch can be worn. No smart/tech watches allowed without prior approval from the Principal or Assistant Principal.

A medic-alert neck chain or bracelet may be worn where this is required for a medically approved reason. Rings, bracelets or necklaces are not acceptable.

Boys

Allowable jewellery for boys is a watch only. A traditional looking, functional watch or tech fitness watch, those that look like and act as a watch can be worn. No smart/tech watches allowed without prior approval from the Principal or Assistant Principal.

A medic-alert neck chain or bracelet may be worn where this is required for a medically approved reason. Rings, bracelets or necklaces are not acceptable.

All students

Body piercing is not acceptable while attending this College (this includes using plastic plugs or Band-Aids or other bandages to cover piercing).

Please note: new piercings are not exempt from the policy.

We don't consider tattoos an acceptable form of adornment for students. It is a determination for when they are adults. So, tattoos are not part of the uniform. If a student was to present with a tattoo, then they would be required to wear clothing to cover up the tattoo whilst at any College activity.

Consequences for not meeting jewellery and body art standard

- 1st offence - lose item for the day and it's handed in to Administration.
- 2nd offence - the item is confiscated and handed in to Administration. A demerit is logged by the teacher on Edumate and letter issued to Parent/Carer. Parent/Carer needs to bring the letter in to collect the jewellery on behalf of their child from Administration.
- 3rd offence - the item is confiscated for the Term and handed in to Administration. A letter is sent to the Parent/Carer advising to collect jewellery at the end of the Term. A detention is logged by the teacher on Edumate.
