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About the College

Whitsunday Christian College is an independent, co-educational, Christian learning community serving school students from the Whitsundays region. The College exists to educate for eternity and equip for life by providing Christ-centred schooling that inspires young people to achieve their full potential for God. The Whitsundays learning community includes: an accredited Prep – Year 12 Day School and Outside School Hours Care (OSHC).

In 2024, our College community embraced the vision of *Living with Purpose*. We placed a strong focus on developing student leadership through *Leading with Purpose*—our framework designed to nurture faith, character, and service in action. Throughout the year, students were given meaningful opportunities to lead, contribute to school culture, and represent their peers with purpose. Student voice was strengthened, with leaders playing an active role in shaping events, leading traditions, initiating new ideas and experiences while representing the College within the broader community. A standout moment was our biannual *Night Under the Stars*, where students took the lead in planning, creating, and hosting a wide range of community stalls and entertainment. 


Staff Development

We expect all staff to grow professionally each year. Whether in administrative practices, bus driving skills or teaching methodology, staff members need to be developing their skills, gifts and expertise. At a school level the leadership team set corporate learning goals. Each staff member has the responsibility to ensure their practice is improving based on their individual needs and role, and this is supported through the Performance Development Framework. This structured process, guided by the Professional Standards and the National Christian Distinctives, helps staff reflect on their performance, set growth goals, and align their development with the school's mission and values. In addition, our teachers take part in national and state conferences, belong to a range of professional organisations and undertake action research-based learning to continually review what we do in terms of best practice.

The average attendance rate for the whole school as a percentage in 2024 was 89%.

Non-attendance at Whitsundays is monitored by our school management software program, Edumate. An SMS is sent to parents who have not notified the College of intended absence, to confirm the child's absence and parents are expected to respond with an explanation. If unexplained, this will be followed up with a phone call. Parents are encouraged to notify of absences, or confirm absences through the OrbitApp, phone call or SMS. Our school leaders and chaplain are available to assist with school refusal and any underlying problems that may be hindering a student's desire to attend school regularly. NAPLAN results for Years 3,5,7 and 9

Helping every student achieve his or her personal best is part of our mission at Whitsunday Christian College. To help students achieve we are committed to using a range of data collection tools to inform our teaching and learning. These tools include the use of standardised testing, such as the National Assessment Program.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is conducted annually for Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students. The data we receive from students participating in the program enables us to analyse individual progress and how particular groups of students are developing. This informs our teaching of



individuals and allows us to evaluate our programs of study. We can then plan for and apply school resources to address learning needs.

At Whitsundays we have developed a supportive approach to NAPLAN, minimising performance pressure. We encourage every Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 student to participate in the assessments each May.

Students achieve across the full range of scores. Whitsundays is committed to lifting the literacy and numeracy performance of all students including those with English as additional language and those who have recognised learning needs.
